

NON-TRANSPORTABLE ITEMS

You should transport valuable and irreplaceable items with you rather than on the moving truck. In addition, there are several items that cannot be put on the truck, such as explosives, compressed gases, flammable liquids and solids, oxidizers, poisons, corrosives as well as radioactive and other hazardous materials.

Hazardous Materials

Movers cannot accept flammable, corrosive or explosive goods.
